4 Location and Working Conditions:

- Position Location: Outer Island Fish Market Center (OIFMC) Majuro
- Two-year contract with 6-month probation period and possibility of extension subject to performance evaluation.
- Full time (56 hours per week).

The Deckhand spends extended periods at sea and must endure all kinds of weather conditions, most often damp and cold conditions. Sea mariners also face the possibility of unexpected severe weather conditions and other hazards associated with working with heavy loads, or having to sail at night.

However, modern safety management procedures, advanced emergency communications, and effective international rescue systems place modern mariners in a much safer position than the past. Some mariners have a difficult time of coping with long periods away from home and the confinement aboard ship and consequently leave the occupation

Physical Demands

The Deckhand will spend long hours keeping watch, either steering or performing look out duty while vessel is in operation. During fish collections is responsible for preparing daily meals for crew and must also attend to fishermen (Distribute ice, fishing gears, fuel, and other supplies- must Sort/ categorize, weigh, stow and ice all fish products) at all hours which will deprive Deckhand of normal resting or sleeping hours.

Environmental Conditions

The Boat Deckhand is constantly stationed in transport vessel out in the outer islands/between Majuro/Mili or in open seas, and will expose to all weather and climate conditions.

Sensory Demands

The incumbent must spend long hours in monitoring navigational equipment's and engine and must spend long hours attending to fishermen (distribute ice, fishing gears, fuel, and other supplies - must sort/categorize, weigh, stow and ice all fish products) while at fishing sites. The incumbent must also spend long hours on either steering or performing look out duty while vessel is in operation which requires high levels of attentiveness.

Must maintain outer structure of vessel; sanding, painting, and fiberglass repair. Must inspect and scrape clean vessel hull (Bottom of vessel) every month to ensure safe and efficient seafaring. At ports or site destinations shall be responsible for tying up or casting off lines holding vessel in place or lowering and raising anchors. The Deckhand must be ready at any given time to perform repair and to assist vessel engineer troubleshoot any problems that may arise while during voyages. Deckhands in general learn about navigation, safety, and environmental and government regulations. The vessel Engineer must also attend to other responsibilities within fish collection procedures, such as securing fuel and supplies, distribution of fuel, ice and other supplies. - Communicating with Site managers and Majuro/Ebeye base Providing information to managers, co-workers, and Captain by radio or in person in regards to fishing conditions, catch rate, etc.
- o Monitor and Control the distribution of ice

- Monitor the loading and discharging of cargo or passengers and collecting fares
- o Distribute fuel and supplies
- Maintain equipment's on board, such as engines, winches, navigational systems, fire extinguishers, and life preservers.
- Cook daily meals for crew

- Logs for fuel sales, ice, and supplies are completed accurately for inventory verification.
- Information on fishing conditions, catch rates, and operations is communicated clearly and promptly to Site Managers, Majuro/Ebeye base, Captain, and crew (by radio or in person).
- Nutritious daily meals are prepared and served to the crew on schedule.
- Food supplies are used efficiently and hygienically, ensuring health and well-being of crew.

6.2 • Comply with newly established working procedures to ensure that cargo and passenger operations are effective and efficient. Main Activities:

- Check receipts prior to loading cargo (Majuro/Ebeye Port)
- Check receipts prior to allowing passengers aboard (Majuro/Ebeye Port)
- Create a log manifest of all cargo and passengers to ensure fare collection is accountable
- During offloading double check cargo manifest to ensure that all cargo is accounted for

- Cargo receipts are checked for accuracy prior to loading at Majuro/Ebeye ports.
- Passenger receipts are verified prior to boarding to ensure fare payment.
- All passengers and cargo from Outer Islands are paid for before boarding; no exceptions.
- Payments for passengers and cargo from Outer Islands are collected directly by the vessel captain.
- A complete log manifest of all cargo and passengers is created before departure.
- Cargo manifests are double-checked during offloading to ensure all cargo is accounted for.
- Log manifests are submitted with sales records upon arrival at Majuro/Ebeye port.
- Manifests are accurate and allow for clear verification of fare collection and cargo/passenger accountability.
- Cargo and passenger loading and offloading operations are conducted efficiently and in an organized manner.
